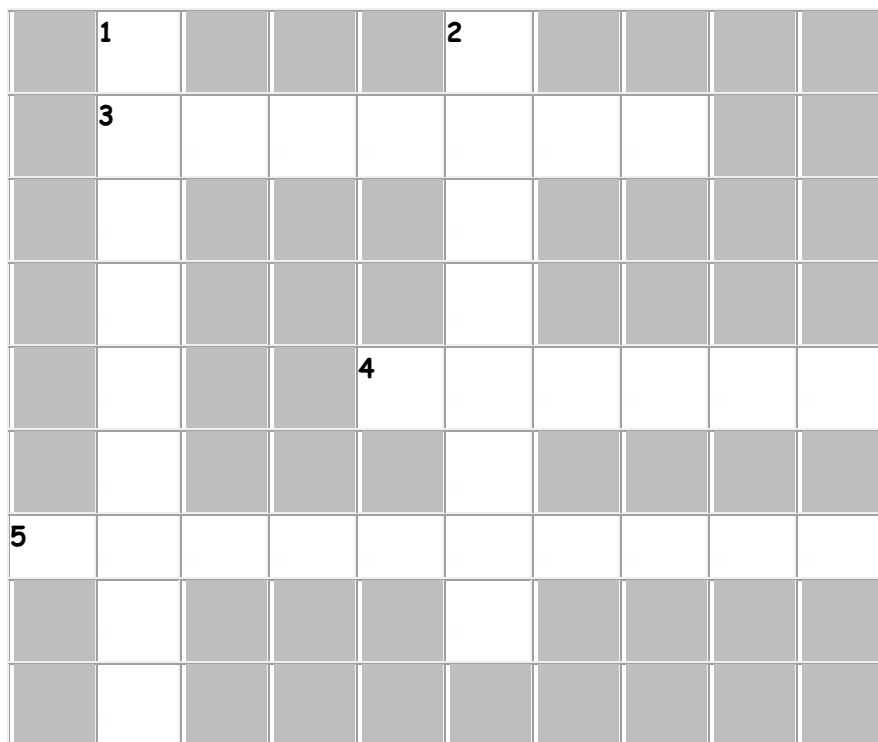


## ΤΡΟΣ ΕΜΜΑΟΥΣ THE JOURNEY TO EMMAUS
