

Pandoleon was born in Nicomedia in modern day Turkey/Asia Minor in 271AD. His father's name was Eustorgios and his mother's name was Euboule. His father was originally a pagan while his mother was Christian. His mother died when he was young. Pandeleimon went on to study medicine and he gained a reputation for being the best doctor in the district. The emperor Maximinian invited him to the palace to become his family doctor.

Everyone loved Pandeleimon. One day he met a Christian priest named Ermolaos who taught him about Christ. Ermolaos told Pandeleimon that with the power of Christ he could heal any sickness or disease without any medicine. One day he saw a young boy who died from a poisonous snake bite and thinking on the Ermolaos' words, he began to pray to Christ. The boy came back to life and Pandeleimon believed in Christ with all his heart. From that moment on Pandeleimon changed his way of life - he was baptised and officially became a Christian. Pandeleimon often left the palace and wandered the streets seeking out poor people to heal. He performed many miracles with the help of God and never accepted any money. However, because he became so well-known many doctors became jealous and reported him to the emperor because he was a Christian. Maximinian then ordered that Pandeleimon be tortured. Although he endured many tortures, Pandeleimon with the help of God never lost his faith. He died on the 27<sup>th</sup> of July of 304 AD.)
